

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING: MIDAS PROGRAM www.xavier.edu/midas

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Master of Science in Nursing: Direct Entry as Second Degree (MIDAS) program is designed for mature, goal-directed individuals who have a bachelor's degree in a discipline other than nursing who desire to be a licensed registered nurse (RN).

The 20-month MSN MIDAS program is a rigorous full-time, five consecutive semester fall entry program (fall/spring/summer/fall/spring). The seventy-nine credit hour curriculum is taught onsite and practicum experiences are at healthcare facilities in the greater Cincinnati area. Students successfully completing the program graduate with a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) and are eligible to sit for the National Council Licensure Exam-Registered Nurse (NCLEX-RN).

Within this generic master's program is the American Association of Colleges of Nursing's Clinical Nurse Leader (CNL) role. "In practice, the CNL oversees care coordination of a distinct group of patients and actively provides direct patient care in complex situations. The master's degree-prepared clinician puts evidence-based practice into action to ensure that patients benefit from the latest innovations in care delivery." (CNL Fact Sheet www.aacn.nche.edu/cnl). MIDAS graduates are eligible to sit for the Clinical Nurse Leader certification exam.

MIDAS graduates are also eligible to sit for the holistic nursing certification exam (see endorsements below).

PRE-REQUISITE COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Pre-requisites include a two semester or three quarter series of anatomy and physiology (lectures and labs), a microbiology course, and a statistics course. Science courses must be no older than five years. Applicants must obtain approval of pre-requisite course work, including courses previously completed and those remaining to be completed. Strong applicants may be offered admission prior to completion of pre-requisites. However, all pre-requisites must be successfully completed and grades reported prior to the start of the fall semester.

APPLICATION AND ADMISSION

Prospective students may apply for admission year-round. Applications are reviewed beginning in late January for the upcoming fall semester entry term – the fall semester begins approximately the third week in August. Admission is offered to qualified, strong applicants on a rolling basis. To begin an application process, click the APPLY link at www.xavier.edu. Required are official transcripts for all college and university coursework, official Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores, three recommendations, an essay and a resume. Grades for pre-requisite courses in progress must be submitted to the School of Nursing by the date designed in the acceptance letter.

NOTE: A past felony or misdemeanor conviction may result in disqualification for the state licensure examination (as outlined in Section 4723.28 of the Ohio Revised Code).

TUITION AND FINANCIAL AID

Some scholarship support is available through the School of Nursing. Other funding can be explored through corporate or privately funded scholarships designated for nursing students. The University designates funds each year for distribution among MIDAS students in the form of small grants based upon FAFSA results.

Xavier's Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) program is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) approved by the Ohio Board of Nursing (OBN) and endorsed by the American Holistic Nurses Credentialing Corporation (AHNCC).
